MEETING OF November 18, 2019

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by J. Luongo. REVIEW OF MINUTES: Minutes from the October meeting were approved by Cheryl Polverino and seconded by Cindy Livingston.

CORRESPONDENCE: Correspondence from RGA presenting preservation plan for review prior to submission to SHPO. Two letters from the Chairman to Ronardi seeking information regarding attendance to the Architectural Achievement Award ceremony scheduled for 11/26.

NEW BUSINESS: Reviewed preservation plan produced by RGA. Cookie replied to RGA and advised them to move forward. Cookie explained Cincinnati Hall and Dr. Henderson's position in the Revolutionary War, as well as the impending passive park to the guests present who had numerous questions.
